Danish law on parallel society

- The Danish government has published an official list of vulnerable residential areas annually since 2010 with three categories:
 - Vulnerable residential area (*udsat boligområde*)
 - Parallel society (*parallelsamfund*)
 - Redevelopment area (*omdannelsesområde*)
- Since 2021 a list of prevention areas (*forbyggelsesområder*) has also been published

Definition: Vulnerable residential areas

A social housing area with at least 1,000 residents that fulfil at least two of the following four criteria:

- The share of inhabitants aged 18–64 neither in employment nor education is higher than 40%
- The share of inhabitants convicted for infractions against the penal law, weapons law or drug regulations is more than three times as high as the national average
- The share of inhabitants aged 30–59 with only primary education is greater than 60%
- The average gross income for inhabitants aged 15–64 (excluding those in education) is less than 55% of the average gross income for the region

Definitions:

Parallel society and Redevelopment area

A social housing area that fulfil the criteria for “Vulnerable residential area” and in addition:

- If the share of immigrants or descendants of immigrants from non-Western countries is higher than 50%, the area is officially proclaimed a “parallel society” (*parallelsamfund*)
- A residential area that has been named as a parallel society for five consecutive years is proclaimed a “redevelopment area” (*omdannelsesområde*)

Consequences

(Some of them)

- All children who are at least one year old and living in a vulnerable residential area are required to attend preschool for at least 25 hours per week in order to learn the Danish language and Danish traditions and norms
- The social housing associations must give priority to applicants who are in jobs or education
- The municipality may provide special effort requirements from the social housing associations such as renovations
- The share of social housing in redevelopment areas has to be reduced to a maximum of 40%
- Individuals receiving certain social welfare benefits face restrictions on moving to redevelopment areas. The same is true for people convicted of crime
- Entire families can be evicted if one member is convicted of a crime

Definition: Prevention area

A social housing area with at least 1,000 residents that has a share of non-Western immigrants and descendants of more than 30% - and fulfil at least two of the following four criteria:

- The share of inhabitants aged 18–64 neither in employment nor education is higher than 30%
- The share of inhabitants convicted for infractions against the penal law, weapons law or drug regulations is more than twice as high as the national average
- The share of inhabitants aged 30–59 with only primary education is greater than 60%
- The average gross income for inhabitants aged 15–64 excluding those in education is less than 65% of the average gross income for the region
